


Mailbox Creation using new Service Manager

Thank you for choosing Exchange Defender for all of your hosting and email security needs. We wanted you to say hello to the new look and feel of our revamped Service Manager, coming in 2018. This guide is intended to walk you through creating new Hosted Exchange Mailboxes using our new interface.

Step 1: Add a Mailbox


So when you're ready to create a new mailbox, click on the 'Actions' button and a menu should appear with the selections 'Add Mailbox' 'Add Public Folder' 'Add External Contact' 'Add Distribution Group'. Select 'Add Mailbox'.






Step 2: Enter Contact Information

On this screen you'll have to fill out your contact information. This is so we can keep track of who's creating accounts for auditing purposes.




Step 3: Domain Selection

Once you select **Continue**, you'll be presented with the Domain Selection Screen. Here you'll have 2 options.



1. **Domain Selection** – Here you'll pick from a list of domains that you are currently servicing to create the new account.



2. Add New Domain – If you're onboarding a new client, here's where you'll put in their domain name.


Step 4: Account Setup

Once you're done selecting your options, on the next screen you'll be taken to the Account Setup screen. Here is where you'll configure the account



- 1. **Display Name** Here you will add their First name, middle initial and Last name.
- 2. Here's where you configure the account details. Remember the Username must be unique and cannot match the actual email address.
- 3. When creating passwords, you'll now be given the option to generate a random password. The password strength must be at 'Very Strong' in order to proceed with account creation.




Step 5: Service Configuration


The Next section is for the Service Configuration. Here you'll choose what platform to put the exchange accounts on and then the type of service you service options you want. You can choose between Hosted Exchange Pro or Hosted Exchange Essentials. For Hosted Exchange Pro you have a couple of actions that you can add to the account.

1. For Exchange OS, you have 2 options, Exchange 2010 and Exchange 2013

Exchange OS:




2. For Type Of Service, as stated above you have between Hosted Exchange Pro + 2 addon's that can be selected at any time and Hosted Exchange Essentials.



Step 6: Account Confirmation


